

**SUPPLEMENT 1
TO THE CALL FOR PAPERS
38TH OTDK
MEDICAL AND HEALTH SCIENCES SECTION**

In the Medical and Health Sciences Section, only an abstract must be submitted; no written TDK paper is required.

Rules for the abstract:

- **Only the main text must** be uploaded to the OTDT online system, the other data (names of authors, institution, names and titles of supervisor(s) etc.) are generated by the online system.
- Content requirements: a structured format is recommended (Introduction, Methods, Results, Discussion)
- Length: minimum 500 and maximum 2,500 characters, including spaces.
- Language: Hungarian or English.

At the conference, participants will have **10 minutes to the oral presentation of their TDK paper (presentation), followed by a 5-minute discussion.**

The language of the presentation must match the language of the abstract.

Evaluation criteria for the TDK presentation:

1. Results, professional content, presentation (maximum 20 points)	Score
Abstract, formal requirements, scientific information content	0-5
Explanation of the background of the research; emphasis on the importance of objectives and hypotheses; presentation of the methods used and the research process; scientific interpretation of the results, methodology of evaluation, description of issues encountered during the research; connection between the conclusions and the objectives; outline of future research directions.	0-15
2. Performing style, quality of the presentation (maximum 10 points)	Score
The presentation follows the structure of scientific presentations; the presenter appropriately uses the terminology of the field when presenting their results; the presenter avoids unnecessary use of foreign-language technical terms; incorporates national and international scientific findings into the presentation; the presenter's style is confident, the language of the presentation is easily understandable, and the structure is logical.	0-10
3. Use of visual aids, demonstration (maximum 10 points)	Score
Use of available visual aids; the quantity, quality, and informational content of the figures; the figures maximally contribute to the understanding of the presentation.	0-10

4. Debate skills and professional competence (maximum 10 points)	Score
<p>The presenter's responses to questions are confident, professionally accurate, and focused on the questions asked; the presenter is informed about the field's achievements and maintains a connection with the audience.</p> <p>If the presentation exceeds the allotted time by more than 30 seconds, a maximum of 5 points can be awarded for the discussion.</p> <p>If the presentation reaches 15 minutes, the discussion cannot begin, and no points can be awarded for debate skills.</p>	<p>0-10</p>

5. Own work/Appendix slide	Score
<p>Reviewers pay special attention to the extent to which the results presented in the presentation can be considered the student's own work. It is expected that an appendix slide be shown as the last slide of the presentation, in which the student briefly lists their own contributions to the results. <i>In the evaluation (i.e., point allocation), only the student's own work is assessed. Accordingly, a presentation without an appendix slide detailing your own work will not be scored. On the appendix slide, the student must declare whether they used AI tools in preparing the presentation and, if so, in what manner.</i></p>	<p><i>Without an appendix slide, the presentation cannot be scored!</i></p>
